We are inclined to believe that the Montreal and Ottawa newspapers are becoming unduly active as prophets of political possibilities. We are now advised, for instance, by a special correspondent of the Montreal Gazette that "the Federal General Elections will take place the latter part of September, and that the Provincial Elections in New Brunswick will not be held for some time, being delayed until after the Ottawa results are known."

THE SESSION OF PARLIAMENT. The session of Parliament which ended on Saturday was anything but a promising preparation for the appeal of a general election which seemed to be contemplated by the Government at its beginning.

The weary waste of time in the early months was followed by an attempt to crowd through a lot of business in the closing weeks with unprofitable results. Measure after measure proposed by the Government failed to pass. The plan to subsidize a line of steamships to secure a reduction of ocean freight charges was heralded by a report from W. T. R. Preston, which actually hurt the project.

Protest Filed.

New Brunswick, July 1.—St. James Presbyterian church held a roll call vote in St. James Hall on the Church Union question which resulted in a majority in favor of Church Union, the vote standing 50 to 28. Mayor R. T. D. Allison, on behalf of the non-concurrents, filed a protest on the following grounds: "That the said meeting was irregularly called; that no notice of said meeting had been given; that no proper notice of said meeting had been given; that the roll of membership prepared and presented for a voting at said meeting was not a proper and legal roll under the laws constituting and governing St. James church as a corporate body. That no vote had been taken by the congregation of St. James church under the provisions of the United Church of Canada Act, 1-15 George V., chapter 100. That no provision had been made for taking a roll according to law."
