

MORE CIVIL STRIFE IN CANADA

Halifax, April 2.—There is strong possibility of trouble beween the Dominion Coal Company and the Provincial Workmen's Association, in which the coal miners are banded together. There are 12,000 employes of the Dominion Coal Co., of which practically all belong to the P. W. A. For several weeks, particularly in Cape Breton, the P. W. A. have been displaying extraordinary activity. They have refused to work in mines with new union men, until the latter joined the Association. They are now out. The nonunionists' joining, the Company now refuse to take back the orginal strikers. General Manager Duggan says that the company will not only resist the principle of the closed shop, but will not tolerate any interference with what he is pleased to style "free labor." At the general elections of 1904, Independent Labor Party ran candidate in one of the Cape Bre ton County Constitiencies, with good showing, although not formally endorsed by the Union.
