It began in a small way and during that long period it has had it's changes, but through all it has constantly endeavored to serve the people to the best of it's capacity as a newspaper. It's plant now occupies three floors with a space of nearly 6000 square feet. It has a battery of four linotype machines as a part of it's equipment.
