ROCAP TO REFERRE FIGHT

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., June 12.—The selection of William H. Rocap, sporting editor of the Philadelphia Public Ledger, as referee for the heavyweight championship fight between Jess Willard and Jack Dempsey in Toledo on July 4th, was announced yesterday by Major A. J. Druxel Biddle, Major Biddle, as president of the Army, Navy and Civilian Board of Boxing Control, was requested by Tex Rickard, promoter of the fight, to name the referee, said he had wired Rickard a week ago that his personal choice lay between Rocap and Jack Shelly, of Yorkers, N. Y.

Tex Rickard, in appealing to the Boxing Board of Control for a referee, remarks that until the naming of a government board, pro boxing just ran loose in a very bad way. It did the same in England. Under the said Agreement do not exceed ten per cent. of the estimated cost of the construction and equipment of the Railway, and it is nevertheless desirable to proceed with the undertaking.

And whereas a By-Law to provide for the construction, equipment and operation of the Railway was duly submitted to and has received the approval of the Electors of the Corporation and the Council of the Corporation has finally passed the said by-law.

Now therefore it is resolved by the Council of this Municipal Corporation that the Reeve and Clerk of this Corporation sign the said Agreement and affix the seal of the Corporation thereto in accordance with the provisions of the Hydro Electric Railway Act.

And that the Commission is hereby requested to proceed with the undertaking, notwithstanding any failure on the part of the Municipal Corporation above mentioned to pass a by-law approving of the said Agreement. Carried.

On motion of Deputy-reeve Walker, and Councillor Haynes, a number of accounts were passed and paid.

Council adjourned to meet again at the same place on Monday, July 14th, at 1.30 o'clock p.m. L. S. BESSY, Clerk.
