General News.

A New Comer to the London Music Hall.

A new comer to the London music hall is Dan Sullivan, "The Tipperary Wonder," who lifts with his teeth a horse weighing about 800 pounds harnessed to a light cart weighing about 350 pounds in weight, and four fair-sized men, the total weight being nearly a ton.

The Queen of the Belgians is reported to be one of the best living performers on the harp.

When recently her chief lady in waiting became ill, she was called upon to present the postulant at the altar, and then played a solo on the harp, to the great delight of the Sisters who thronged the convent.

The greatest statue in the world is the "Berthold statue," on Bellin's Island, New York Bay, presented to America by the people of France.

Its height is 305 feet. It weighs 220 tons. Some estimate of the size of this colossal figure may be formed from the dimensions of the forefinger which is 8 feet in length and 4 feet nine inches around the second joint. The head is 14 1/2 feet high and the nose 3 feet 10 inches long.

Mr. Alexander Sullivan, of the Chicago Herald, who is conceded to be the ablest woman journalist in the country, commands a salary of \$160 per week.

Mrs. Sullivan's maiden name is Margaret F. Donohue, and she was born in Tyrone, Ireland, from which she emigrated with her family to this country when a little girl. She taught in the public schools of Chicago, and Chicago for several years and has written a book on the Irish question which the late James R. Spalding praised for its accuracy and completeness.

Among the presents carried to the Holy Father by Cardinal Moran from Australia was a gold fish filled with gold coins from the Sisters of the Sacred Heart at Sydney Harbor.

The sums of money given to the Pope during his episcopal jubilee by the people of Australia, by Catholic orders and by individuals, amount to \$1,816,000. The American pilgrims gave \$129,000.

The Pope has paid an unusual honor to a Scotch Protestant professor and author. He has ordered "The Church in the Roman Empire before 70," by Professor Ramsay, to be placed in the reference library of the Vatican and has awarded a gold medal to the author.

Monsieur Gadd, who is to represent the English hierarchy at the Chicago Convention, is the nephew of the chaplain of the Manchester prisons, and in that capacity he attended the Manchester martyrs, Allen, Larkin and O'Brien, in their last moments. The Manchester martyrs, who were executed in 1842, were brought to this country, which he has previously visited two or three times.

In the audacious which Cardinal Moran had with the Holy Father, His Eminence pronounced the Pope's jubilee congratulations, and that was from the Bishops of Australia, and the others were from the Bishops of the Holy See, representing 15,000 members of the Catholic young men of Queensland, the Sisters of Charity from Manly College, and from the Nuns of the Sacred Heart of the Harbor of Sydney.

One of the most striking characteristics of the Chicago Convention is the modesty of the man. At Chicago, during his recent visit, it is said of him that he went about with no more ostentation than the humblest workman of the most modest trade; and at Notre Dame he hastened to greet the venerable Father Serin, who returned a sick couch to pay his respects to the Papal representative, and then he placed on the platform to conduct the venerable founder, when he appeared at the doorway of the hall, to a seat of honor on the stage.

The following incident is related as having occurred during the Holy Week in a town of Dalmatia, in Southern Europe: A soldier went to receive Holy Communion without first going to confession. Returning from the sacred table, he placed the consecrated host in his pocket-book. When he arrived at the barracks he joined his comrades, who were just eating, saying to them, jokingly: "You said what you have, I'll see what I have." Suddenly he had the consecrated host, which he had placed in his pocket-book, fall to the ground, as though struck by lightning, and become black as coal.
