When the people of the Bay heard that their birthright was in danger they protest ed against it, and the Government o Robert Bond upheld the protest of the fishermen and refused to grant the land in question, because of it being the fishermen's reserve. Now what has happened? A Mr. Bernard McGrath, a schoolmaster, from King's Cove, has secured from the Morris Government not only all the land of the Great Sandy Hr.
