

## Municipal Council

## WEEKLY MEETING.

The weekly meeting of the Council held yesterday afternoon at four o'clock Mayor Cook presided and Messrs. Martin, Outerbridge, Vincent, Ryan and Collier were present. The following business was transacted:

Mr. E. Rogers wrote re unsanitary condition of Queen's Road, and about by houses on this road not having water and sewerage. The owners of these houses were written to immediately to comply with the Municipal Regulations and that if the installations were not made within the time allowed the modification, legal proceedings will be taken against them.

Mr. E. McRae drew attention to the property, near George St. and surface drainage, and suggested the need of drains being placed along the street so as to avoid the damage. The City Engineer is to investigate and report.

Mr. J. H. Lakin for damages done by blasting, Southside Road, amounting to \$22,000 was ordered to be paid.

Mr. Lakin's offer to supply a small quantity of hay at less than current prices was accepted.

Communication was tabled from Mr. Hayward, Powers Court, Signal Road, calling attention to unsanitary conditions at this place and the need of better lighting facilities. The former matter will be attended to by the City Engineer, while the latter will be referred to the Lighting Committee.

Mr. O'Driscoll, Limited applied for a permit on behalf of Richard Waterford Bridge Road. The permit will be issued by the Engineer, conditionally, i.e. building regulations to be complied with and the effect.

Communications were read from J. Basha, Shaw St. and L.J. Chandler, Charlton Street, in regard to the placement upon their respective properties. During the month of December and January of last year, the assessment books were open for the inspection of the public, and a meeting of the Council was held during the month of December to consider the objections taxpayers might have to the valuations. As no such objections were raised by Mr. Basha or Mr. Chandler at the time referred to, the Council are unable to make any alterations in the valuation recorded.

The attention of the Board was called to the present unsanitary condition of the Southside Road. The Board was given the Sanitary Department to have the men of this Department clean up this thoroughfare immediately.

The condition of Water Street pavement near the car rails was again the subject of considerable discussion. The Street Railway Company are to be asked to have that portion of the street repaved at once. The condition of the sidewalk on this street was also referred to, and the property owner was notified to have the same repaved immediately, otherwise steps will be taken to compel him to do so.

The swimming pool at Long Pond, which was opened last week, was frequented by some hundreds of people. The Mayor, Mr. Lawrence Hickey, was present at the opening, and presented a medal from the Royal Humane Society, and the Council were foremost in securing his services.

The application of Messrs. Wills, Messrs. Leslie Street, for water service connections to their premises, will be granted, conditional upon their making sufficient deposit to the Council for the work.

Building permits were granted to the approval of the City Engineer, (Extensions), George Sinclair, Prince of Wales Street; Henry C. Cabot Street (Garage), J. P. O'Sullivan, Duckworth Street (Dwellings), E. G. Taylor, Patrick Street.

During the past week the widening of the Waterford Bridge Road, which was temporarily suspended, pending the award of compensation to the owners of land taken, was again resumed. The improvement in transportation which will result from the widening of this road will be a valuable one. Many other necessities of this kind are being completed, and there are various other projects of the city where they are urgently needed, but at the present time the limited finances of the city make it impossible for the Council to undertake any other works than those which are being completed.

It is hoped that the accommodation requested of the Government for guaranteed loan of \$100,000 for local improvements, such as water and sewerage extension in new districts, widening of streets which are so narrow and dangerous to traffic of any kind, will be forthcoming. It is hoped that the Council will have the assistance financially in the work.
