Washington, March 4.—The sixty-first Congress came to an end today by constitutional limitation.

Despite the peril that threatened some of the big appropriation bills almost up to the last moment, they all finally got through, and received the signature of the President. The ast bill signed by the Speaker of the House was the postoffice

The House adjourned at 12:35 p.m. The Senate adjourned at 12:20 p.m.

TO CALL EXTRA SESSION.

Washington, March 4.-At 12:07 President Tait announced that this afternoon he would issue his call for an extra session of Congress, the date not yet fixed, for the consideration of the Canadian reciprocity bill.
