Dublin, Sept. 9.—Patrick McHugh, M.P. for the north division of Leitrim, was released from Sigo fall this morning at the expiration of his sentence of three months imprisonment for contempt of court. He was accorded a great reception in which the Mayor, the town councillors and 2,000 Nationalists took part. The streets of Sigo were decorated with flags in his honor. In an interview Mr. McHugh heatedly denounced the methods of his political opponents, which he described as only comparable in malignity to the tribunals which Rebesplerre set up during the reign of terror.
