In the decade under review a new industry of vast magnitude was created. Twelve years ago electricity, as applied to street cars, for power purposes of all kinds, for house and street illumination, was a new thing. In fact, electric street railroads have only been in successful operation about half that time. The electrical age about half that time. The electrical age was practically just commencing and the aggregate capital invested, outside of telegraphy, was small. Now almost any town of any size has its electric railroad, streets everywhere are being lighted by electricity, and electricity furnishes power for factories to run elevators and for many other purposes; still we have scarcely seen the beginning of electrical development. Already, however, the capital invested in all branches of this industry—and nearly all invested since 1880—is estimated at \$80,000,000. A Wrong From Britain To India.
