AN HONORED PROPHETESS.

People of Paris Had Great Faith in Madame Thebes.
An extraordinary career ended with the passing away of Madame Thebes in Paris. Until the outbreak of the war her prophetic genius won world-wide renown, but for the last year or two her guessing has been wont to miss rather than make the mark.

She has been one of the romantic figures of Paris for a number of years. With good looks, magnetic personality, and her uncanny insight, she has won her way into some of the most exclusive salons. She always wore an air of mysticism, and after the manner of her kind was apt to go into trances for indefinite periods. Her tongue was two-edged and she was feared as much as she was feted.

Madame Thebes has had a lengthy career and for some time past her health had been failing. Her son was killed recently in the war. When interviewed in Paris last March she was a broken-down old woman shivering by the fire, but with lambent flames of her old spirit still appearing at times.

"The disappearance of one of the principal authors of the war will bring about a great change," she said on this occasion.
"Which of the two I cannot tell. The future is too dim. Many shapeless shadows pass before my eyes. The sinister old man and the modern Nero. Both of them are marked men. Death follows them and will suddenly betray them both. The Hohenzollern will die a madman or else by violent means, suicide, or assassination, I cannot say which. The Emperor and Prince Henry of Prussia and perhaps one of his sons, will alone survive the Kaiser." The "old man" referred to is presumably the late Francis Josef of Austria.

She foretold with accuracy the date of the death of Pope Pius, and months before the war clouds loomed up she prophesied that France in 1914 would be drawn into a great war from which she would emerge victorious.
It was the habit of Madame Thebes to issue an annual book of predictions, and in her volume for 1915 she foretold the latest earthquake in Italy which occurred in January, 1915. Among other successful prophecies were the fall of Khartoum, the assassination of President Carnot, and the death of Queen Victoria.

One of her really remarkable prophecies was that of the great bazaar fire which occurred in Paris some years ago, and in which many of the French noblesse lost their lives.
It must be admitted that most of Madame Thebes' prophecies regarding the war have already proved fallacious, and her popularity waned in proportion. There was a time when the French people had the utmost faith in everything their seersess told them.

In any event, the sayings of Madame Thebes will be missed from the strange conglomeration of fact and fancy that is Paris.

Terms Used in Crocheting.
