Canada is not the only country where the farmers are seeking relie in the form of easier credits. I the United States, in Australia and in other countries where a large portion of the population is engaged in agricultural pursuits there is the same demand for something to offset the economic consequences of the slumi in the markets for farm products the prices of which are directly affected by the buying power of Europe. 
