CONTRACTS OPEN.
RICHMOND, QUE.—Mr. Samuel Cleveland will erect a new mill at this place.
SACKVILLE, N. B.—Mount Allison University will build a students' residence this year, to cost \$40,000.
BLESBIE, ONT.—The stove and hoop factory of Mr. J. B. Coates, which was destroyed by fire recently, will be rebuilt immediately.
BRAMPTON, ONT.—Messrs. G. R. Anderson & Bro., dry goods merchants, are about to enlarge their premises by a one-story addition.
SOREL, QUE.—A by-law has been carried by the ratepayers granting a bonus of \$12,000 to Mr. Hobbs for the erection and operation of a cotton factory.
BRANTFORD, ONT.—The Messrs. Harris Company are making arrangements to commence the erection of a building three stories high, 300 feet by 60 feet.
CARMAN, MAN.—Messrs. Walker & Catson will erect a flour and oatmeal mill here, with a capacity of 200 barrels flour and 75 barrels of oatmeal per day.
NELSON, MAN.—Tenders have been called for building the court house, for the erection of which the provincial government has set aside an appropriation of \$9,000.
OWEN SOUND, ONT.—The township councils of Sarawak and Keppel have granted an extension of time for the construction of the G. T. R. western extension from Park Head to Owen Sound until November 1st, 1894.
PARRY SOUND, ONT.—Tenders are invited by the Department of Marine and Fisheries, Ottawa, until the 15th inst. for the construction of five range lights leading into the harbor. Plans may be seen at the post office here and in Collingwood.
