The annual meeting of the association was held Tuesday afternoon, before the firing was concluded and consequently with a slim attendance. The council were re-elected, with two changes only, these being the substitution of Mr. Geo. Hayes, of London, for Major Wilson, R.L., Seaforth, and of Capt. Deyell, 46th, for Major Baillie, 47th.

Several improvements were suggested to the council by competitors, the suggestions being embodied in resolutions adopted by the meeting. These included the introduction of the system of fixing a time for each competitor in the regular matches; the distribution of Martini ammunition by the register keepers as well as Snider; the provision of more accommodation for extra series, the reduction of the shots in this from seven to five, and a reduction of the entry fee; and the substitution of the prone for the kneeling position in the Nursery match, at 400 yards.

Attention having been called to the fact that no action appeared to have been taken with respect to the suggestions made by the members at the last annual meeting, the secretary explained that they had received due attention at a meeting of the council, who had not deemed it expedient to adopt any of them. The suggestions so rejected were: That battalion teams should be 5, instead of 8, and that battalions should be at liberty to enter more than one team; that the first stage of the Gibson match should be included in the aggregate; that the hour for holding the annual meeting for members should be changed.
