Your Excellency:  
Upon the instructions of my Government I have the honour to inform you informally and again informally the Royal Hellenic Government through Your Excellency that in all probability I shall leave Athens next July to become the Canadian High Commissioner in Australia.  
In due course I shall have occasion to express the measure of my deep regret to Your Excellency, to their Excellencies the President and the Vice-President of the Council of Ministers, and to the countless good and dear friends whom it has been my privilege to have in brave and glorious Greece.  
I take advantage of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency assurances of my highest consideration.
