

LUXEMBOURG

M. NICOLAS HOMMEL, Permanent Representative at the North Atlantic Council.

Born, 1915. Studied at Louvain and Paris, and was from 1939 to 1941 member of the Luxembourg Bar.

Removed by the occupying Power, from 1941 to 1945, he was a political deportee in a labour camp in Germany.

1945-1946, member of the managing board of the Office of Mutual Aid in Luxembourg.

In 1946, M. Hommel entered the Diplomatic Service.

He was successively Luxembourg's assistant delegate to the Inter-Allied Reparations Agency, Permanent Representative at the OEEC, and member of the Luxembourg delegation at the Conference on the Schuman Plan.

In May, 1951, he was also appointed head of the Luxembourg delegation at the Conference on the EDC, and since November, 1953, he has been the Luxembourg Permanent Representative at the North Atlantic Council.

M. Hommel holds the rank of Counsellor of Legation.
