COMPENSATION TO RURAL POSTMASTERS

Mr. WILSON (Vaudreuil-Soulanges):

1. In view of the return to two cent postage on July 1 next, is it the intention of the government to revise the rates of compensation of rural postmasters?
2. If so, from what date?

Hon. Mr. LAPOINTE:

1 and 2. It is realized that the adoption of the two cent letter rate on 1st July next will result in a substantial decrease in the revenue of rural post offices. As rural postmasters are paid on a commission basis, there would be a corresponding decrease in their salaries, unless their rates of compensation are increased.
