

in their pavilions. With respect to the Canadian Corporation for the 1967 World Exhibition thematic pavilions, four at least will refer to the matter of population growth in their exhibits: "Man in the Community", "Man the Provider", "Man and His Health" and "Man, His Planet and Space".

3. The Canadian Corporation for the 1967 World Exhibition was approached by the Family Planning Association in Montreal, on their own behalf and on behalf of the Family Planning Federation of Canada and of the international organization known as Planned Parenthood World Population. One aspect of the approach was in the nature of a request for space in which these organizations could set up a booth. The approach also brought about discussions on references to the population explosion in our theme exhibits, particularly in the sub-theme "Man and His Community".

4. It was explained to the representatives of these organizations that the exhibition, being one registered by the International Bureau of Exhibitions in the first category, does not provide for the rental or the disposition on a free basis of booths for individual organizations. The discussions with the organizations concerned have proven useful in the development of thematic exhibits on the population explosion, and such discussions are continuing.

What is the salary of an R.C.A.F. flight lieutenant, captain of a Cosmopolitan aircraft, after 10 years in that service?

Hon. Paul Hellyer (Minister of National Defence): The type of aircraft flown has no bearing on rates of pay for pilots in the R.C.A.F. An R.C.A.F. Flight Lieutenant with 10 years in that rank, if married, draws \$833 per month, and a single officer of the same rank draws either \$668 if quarters and rations are provided, or \$763 if quarters and rations are not provided.

AVAILABILITY OF PERITRATE SA

Question No. 919—**Mr. Howe (Hamilton South):**

1. Has a drug of the trade name "Peritrate SA" ever been available in Canada and, if so, is it still available?
2. If it is still available, has consideration been given to removing it from the market, in the light of recent United States findings?

Hon. A. J. MacEachen (Minister of National Health and Welfare): 1. Yes.

2. No, since the United States action was not based on any question of safety or effectiveness of the drug.
