KNOXDALE—HUNT CLUB ARTERIAL ROAD—EXTENSION

Question No. 785-Mr. Baker (Nepean-Carleton):

Has the Department of Public Works, the NCC or any other department or agency made any agreement with the regional municipality of Ottawa-Carleton or any other local government in the national capital, to grant land or the right to use land for the extension of the Knoxdale-Hunt Club arterial road or any part thereof through lands owned or controlled or used by any government department or agency?

Hon. Paul J. Cosgrove (Minister of Public Works): I am informed by the National Capital Commission and the Department of Public Works as follows: In so far as the National Capital Commission is concerned: By virtue of an agreement dated July 1, 1976, between the National Capital Commission, the regional municipality of Ottawa-Carleton, and the city of Ottawa, the NCC has agreed to pay 50 per cent of the cost of the Knoxdale-Hunt Club bridge crossing of the Rideau River. However, no agreement has been made with the regional municipality of Ottawa-Carleton or any other local government in the national capital, to grant land or the right to use land for the extension of the Knoxdale-Hunt Club arterial road or any part thereof through lands owned or controlled or used by the National Capital Commission.

In so far as Public Works Canada is concerned: Public Works Canada has never reached an agreement or met with the regional municipality of Ottawa-Carleton or with any other local government in the national capital to grant land administered by Public Works Canada or the right to use such land for the extension of the Knoxdale-Hunt Club arterial road or any part thereof.
