THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL U¹⁴.

An Act for the relief of Esther Pheobe Brunger Abels.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Esther Pheobe Brunger Abels, residing at Knowlton, in the province of Quebec, wife of Clare Raymond Abels, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the village of Sutton, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the fifteenth 5 day of June, A.D. 1948, at the said village of Sutton, she then being Esther Pheobe Brunger, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved 10 by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

Right to marry again. 1. The said marriage between Esther Pheobe Brunger 15 and Clare Raymond Abels, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

2. The said Esther Pheobe Brunger may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry 20 if the said marriage with the said Clare Raymond Abels had not been solemnized.
