

Enormous Phalanx of Germans Thrown Across San River.

PETROGRAD, May 20.—It is calculated that the enemy has lost 150,000 men since his advance began from the Donajec. General Dmitrieff's army during its successful retreat northeast from Gorlice to the San, accounted for "70,000. The entire Russian army in Galicia is now in a position to manoeuvre as it pleases.
