**D**URING the Month of *December* December  
*ber*, the Weather for the most  
part was clear with Sunshine, but  
intensely Cold. The thick Wea-  
ther, which we sometimes had, was  
principally occasioned by the Vapours that arose  
out of *Port-Nelson* River, that River not being  
then Froze over. There were but three Falls of  
Snow during the Month, and that Snow dusty and  
small. The Frost was continual as in *November*,  
and part of *October*. The Air perfectly dry with-  
out any Fog or Haze, altho' there frequently  
fell in the Nights a great Rime, or Hoar Frost  
that settled on the Bushes. There was more  
Wind in this Month than there was in *November*;  
and the Snow being light and small would in all the  
Plains and open Places, drive with the Wind like  
Dust,
