It is certain the State Department is will-ing to go any reasonable length to sette the difficulty in Venezuela in any manner that shall be honorable and satisfactory to all parties. Therefore, Secretary Hay to day replied to Mr. Bown's cablegram, au-thorizing him, in his discretion, to use his good offices to secure arbitration. He was, however, made to understand that in the erbitration, if one should follow, he would represent, not the government of the United States, but that of Venezuela, at fits request. It is realized here that the catcome is rery doubtful, and the way is beset with difficulties.
