ASSESSMENT NOT FAIR SAY PROPERTY OWNERS

Appeals Regarding Distribution of Cost re Woodlawn Ave. Extension to Be Heard Feb. 11.

The court of revision decided yesterday afternoon to hold a special session on Feb. 11, for the hearing of appeals against the proposed scheme of assessment to meet the cost of extending Woodlawn-avenue northerly to Farnham-avenue.

A number of assessed property owners appeared before the court to urge that the McCormack estimate should be included within the area to be assessed.

The members of the court will look over the property to be affected by the proposed widening of Duncan-street north from Adelaide-street to Queen-street. The cost is estimated at \$80,000.

The special parks committee to consider a comprehensive scheme of park improvement in the city.

The board of revision will sit at 2 p.m. to-day. The board of trade and Guild of Civic Art have already appointed representatives to act as a committee on the subject.

The railway commission will sit at 2 p.m. to-day for the final hearing of the city's application for a viaduct for the street railway.

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
