NEW THEATRE CONTRACT GIVEN

Mayor Wheeler To Erect Moncton House to Replace Burned Structure

MONCTON, April 10.—The new Empress Theatre will be built according to plans submitted by R. A. Frelche and accepted by Messrs. Torrie and Winter. Tenders were opened this morning at 10.30 and the contract awarded to Mayor Ambrose Wheeler of this city, who submitted the lowest tender.

The debris has been completely removed from the site of the old Empress, destroyed by fire, and work on the new building will start immediately.

Plans will soon be completed for the new Capitol, and Mr. Torrie informed the Times-Star reporter this morning that he expected tenders would be asked immediately and work begun in about 10 days.

Messrs. Frelche and Winter are leaving today for Montreal on business and they are desirous of making an inspection of the different systems.
