Speech of Sir Robert Horne  
in Moving the Second

London, Oct. 26.—(Canadian Press  
Cable.)—Sir Robert Horne, chancellor  
of the exchequer, in moving in the  
House of Commons the second reading  
of the Trade Facilities bill providing for  
the extension of the export credits  
scheme and the scheme for guaranteeing  
any government of £25,000,000 said  
loans up to a limit of £25,000,000 said

## ARMY AND NAVY VETERANS MEET IN TORONTO

Toronto, Oct. 26.—The question of the  
amalgamation of all veterans organ-  
izations will be debated at the annual  
convention of the Army and Navy Vet-  
erans in Canada, which opened here yester-  
day.

Major F. C. Taylor in his presidential  
address said a draft resolution would  
be put before the convention which  
would give an opportunity for a de-  
cision on three questions, total amalga-  
mation, immediate federation with a  
view to ultimate amalgamation, or fed-  
eration without intention to amalga-  
mate.

Among resolutions submitted was one  
to petition the government to alienate

the returned soldiers' insurance act from  
the pensions act. Another favored the  
creation of work for the unemployed  
rather than the distribution of doles.

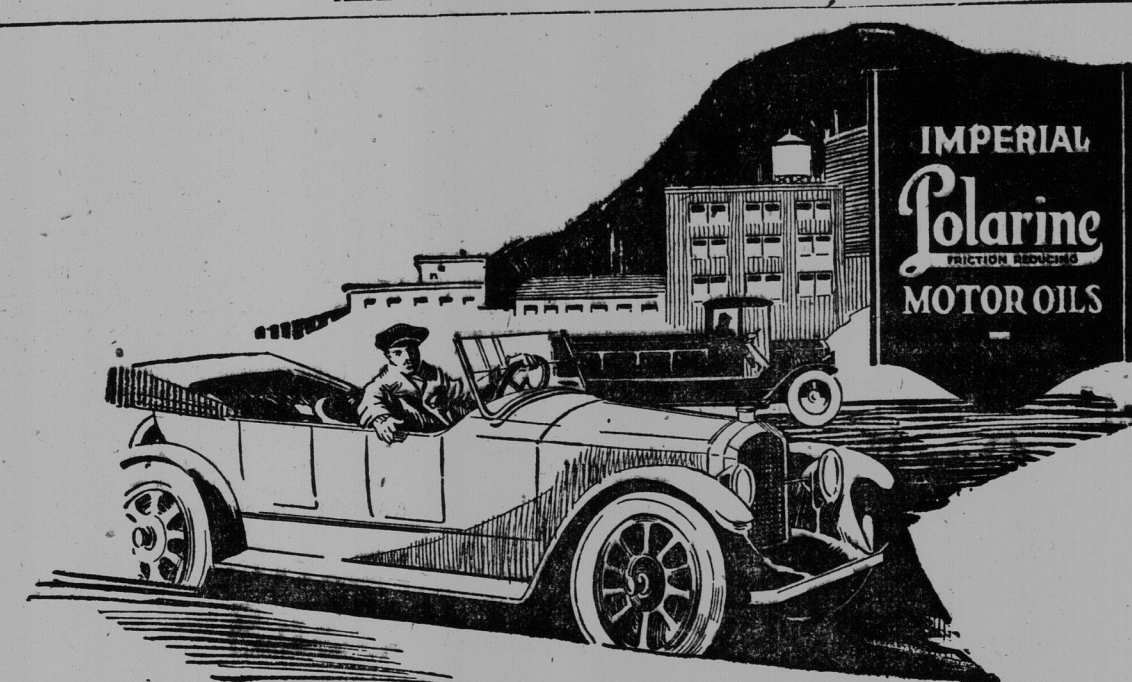
