



The St. John lodge of the Loyal Order of the Moose has made an im-portant new departure. It has been de-cided that the present hall should be given up on May 1, and that the lodge should move to new quarters at 12 Co-burg street, and it has been also de-cided to organize a social club. It was announced at a special meeting last evening that the new quarters would consist of one large room to be for the exclusive use of the social club and the adjoining hall would be used for the meetings of the lodge which are held twice monthly. At the regular meeting of the lodge, held this week, the election of officers took place and re-sulted in the following: Dictator, A. W. Chamberlain; vice-dictator, J. W. Morrell; secretary, W. J. Case; treasur-er, A. W. Covey; prelate, George W. Brogan; sergeant-at-arms, William D. McLennan; past dictator, W. J. Craw-tod.

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At the special meeting held last night, the social club was organized and the following officers elected: Chairman, Edward Hunt; secretary-treasurer, George W. Brogan; managing commit-tee, W. J. Crawford, Herbert Bassett and W. D. McLennan. The constitution and bye-laws of the new club were read and adopted. It was pointed out that it would be necessary for all members of the social club to be members of the lodge, but not necessary that all lodge members should become members of the club. The new club rooms are to be fitted out with pool and billiard rooms and the other paraphernalia necessary for social purposes. There

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
