He had no money, no teachers to help him and no furniture in the stable. But such was the success that attended the work that inside of two weeks he had received money donations enough to rent a building and to furnish it and hire two teachers to help him. Then the work kept on growing until now he is the founder of seven flourishing schools, one of which is for orphans. He said that his father had been an idolater, but had been converted to Christianity and carried on evangelistic work among the lepers. His dying wish had been that all his children should become Christians and his prayer had been answered for all the children are now missionaries.
