OUT BY CROSS

New York, Nov. 14.-Lance Cross of this
city knocked out "One-Round" Hogan of
the Intercontinental, in the second round of a
scheduled ten round bout here tonight.
Hogan was outstaged in the first two
rounds. In the third the Californian land-
ed a left hook to Cross' head. Cross dropped
his head as if the blow had dashed
him. Hogan came on, foiled by the
east sider's ruse, the latter suddenly
straightened up, landed left and right to
the head and body and then, with a ter-
rific right cross to the jaw, put Hogan
to the floor for the full count. Each weigh-
in was 157 pounds.

son, former lightweight champion, had a
close call in a ten round bout with Arthur
Stewart last night. In the second round
he was knocked down with a punch. He
scored a victory, but Stewart failed to follow
up the advantage. In the succeeding

and had his opponent tired and bleeding at
the end of the battle.

STUDENT VOLUNTEER

CONVENTION IN SACKVILLE
(Sackville Tribune.)
H. D. Robertson of Toronto, student
secretary of the Y. M. C. A. for Canada,
was in town on Tuesday and Wednesday
making preliminary arrangements for a
student volunteer convention to be held
here on November 22, 23 and 24. This
convention will be attended by delegates
from the Students Y. M. C. A.'s of the
following colleges in eastern Canada:-
Dalhousie, Acadia, King and Mount Al-
bion. The Y. M. C. A.'s will also be re-
presented and probably the provincial non-
sectarian schools. The Dalhousie association has
sent word that they are planning to send
fifteen representatives and Acadia is plan-
ning to send ten. There will probably be a
total attendance of about seventy-five.
The first session will be on Friday even-
ing, Nov. 22. There will be three sessions
on Saturday and three public services on
Sunday. The pulpit of the various
churches on Sunday will be filled by visit-
ing speakers. All the meetings of the con-
vention will be held in the Sackville Me-
thodist church.

The programme is not yet completed,
but there will be present at least two re-
presentatives from the headquarters of the
Student Volunteers Association in New
York and several local men well known in
missionary work.
