MANY LEARN ABOUT CANADA THROUGH HIM

A Chat With Leo Scheff, British Writer, Now in St. John

"When I compare the conditions of the working people of England and other European countries with the circumstances of the same class of people in this country, when I see the immigrant landing in Canada poor and depressed and find them, a few years later, earning better wages than they had ever dreamed of, comfortably housed, well fed and nicely clad, I find fresh inspiration for my work," said Leo Scheff, special commissioner for the Manchester Guardian and correspondent for several of the greatest British papers, in an interview with a Times reporter.

Mr. Scheff has made several trips to Canada to study the country and find material for descriptive articles, which appear in the papers with which he is connected; but his attitude is quite different from that of many correspondents who, after one quick trip through the country, consider themselves authorities on the dominion, its people and its resources.

Mr. Scheff is continually investigating and continually adding to his knowledge of Canada, but he confesses that he will have to make several more lengthy trips before he will consider himself qualified to write authoritatively of the country as a whole.

In a few years, when he has added considerably to his already vast fund of information, it is his intention to write a series of books on Canada, devoting one to each of the provinces.

In the meantime his articles are being read by millions of people in this country and through their medium many persons, to whom Canada was before but a name, are learning of the opportunities which this country has to offer and are turning their eyes and their ambitions towards the new land of opportunity.

"Every part of Canada has its attraction," said Mr. Scheff, "and the secret of success in immigration is to locate the new settlers in the parts of the dominion which best suits them. For myself, I like the east and I consider that the advantage it has to offer in the way of better social surroundings and more pleasant conditions of living more than compensate for the opportunities of making money faster, which may be found in the west."

"The east has no reason to be jealous of the west," he continued, "for the immigration of the west means a greater field for the eastern manufacturers and, for many years at least, the east must continue to supply the western provinces with the greater portion of the manufactured products which the west demands."

WOMEN'S COUNCIL

Matters of Interest and Importance at Montreal Meeting

Montreal, May 5-At the Saturday night session of the National Council of Women the matter of capital punishment was discussed, after a report had been read by Mrs. Leathe of Toronto, in which there had been reference to a "private hanging being a public execution in Montreal. This caused the meeting to reply by several Montreal ladies who thought it a reflection upon the council of that city."

Miss Peters of St. John moved that the whole paragraph be struck out, saying she wished all executions would be made public so that the world would know the abolition of capital punishment.

Others matters taken up in the report read by Mrs. Leathe were the requests made to the government that wife-desertion and non-support of families be made indictable, and extradition offences and that immigrants who had deserted their wives be deported, the unusual number of divorces granted by the Canadian senate.

Efforts to prevent the employment of white girls by Orientals and the gratifying advance in police methods as affecting women. Toronto has established a women's court and appointed two policewomen.

Montreal and Ottawa each had two policewomen and London expected one would be appointed soon. These recommendations were adopted.

"That the various local councils investigate the problem of child labor, with a view to securing the establishment of a federal bureau of child welfare, under expert."

"That efforts be made to secure the municipal, provincial and Dominion laws for women on equal terms with men."

Miss Fitzgibbon read an important report on immigration and in connection with it, a recommendation was adopted that the government appoint agents to investigate the class of immigrants coming to Canada in their home places, as to the desirability of having them here, and that the immigration department be held responsible for at least a \$5 fine for all undesirable coming to Canada.

A NEW PROFESSION

Representatives of a new profession are now in Richmond, Va., attending classes for recreation workers.

It seems that within the last few years some 6,000 positions in recreation work have been created.

Playground and recreation experts are giving their services without expense to conduct these classes. E. B. DeGroot, now with the Chicago Playground Association, formerly with the Chicago South Park Commission, has had the expenditure of nearly a half million dollars a year for recreation in Chicago.

He has charge of the courses dealing with playground equipment.

George W. Baker, director of the Department of Physical Education at the University of Wisconsin, was formerly secretary of the Baltimore Public School Athletic League and also of the Baltimore Children's Playground Association.

George E. Johnson, besides serving as professor of play at the University of Pittsburgh, has developed one of the strongest playground systems in the United States in Pittsburgh.

Leo F. Hammer, of the Russell Sage Foundation, formerly with the New York Public School Athletic League, Mrs. Jas. J. Storrow, Boston, chairman of the committee on Folk Dancing of the Playground and Recreation Association of America, are among the leaders taking part in the direction of these classes.

The week following the classes hundreds of recreation workers and volunteers who are serving in recreation commissions throughout the country will be in attendance at the Richmond Recreation Congress. It is expected that some delegates from India, China, South America, and from some of the European countries will be present.
