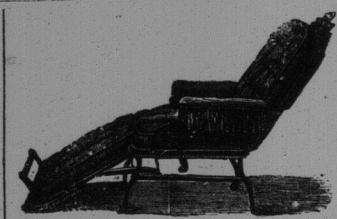

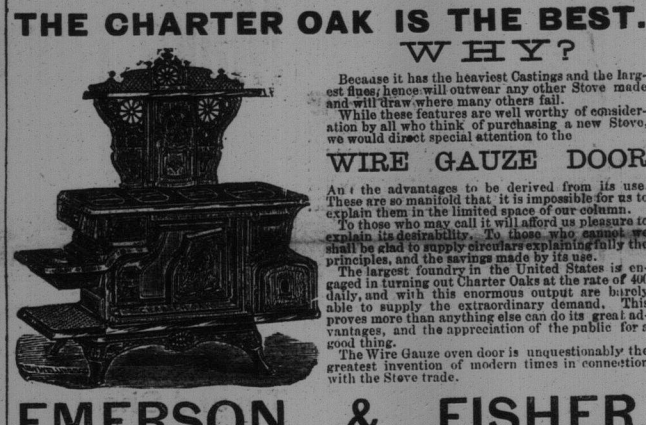

OUTBREAK OF BRITISH ANTI-SEMITISM IN LONDON. The Victim Selected from the Low Class.

New York, Jan. 25.—The Sun says that the victim of the various assaults upon this city and Kingston, Jamaica, is being taken to the Whitechapel, a village near London.

The victim was a man of the lowest and most vicious class whose name has never been discovered. He was found early in the morning lying in a state of insensibility on the pavement of the Whitechapel.

A search was made for the man, but he was not found. On the morning of December 13, in a fielding and partly concealed under an old bed, was found a second body. In this case the woman was a notorious creature of the lowest class, a negro named "Mag."
