paid by grants of money and land, rather than by direct action of the Government. Three of my members, therefore, proceeded for the purpose of carrying on negotiations to that end.

INTER-COLONIAL RAILWAY. You will be glad to learn that the measure adopted to promote economy in the working of the Intercolonial and Prince Edward Island Railways, have resulted in a large reduction of the difference between the existing and proposed rates.

THE TRADING SHIP. I have the gratification of informing you that the Government has generally presented to the House of Commons a bill for the purpose of amending the law relating to the registration of ships.

THE INDIANS. I have thought it well in consideration of the increasing duties thrown upon the country upon the Civil Service, and for the more efficient organization of this service, to issue a circular to examine and report on the whole question.

THE PACIFIC RAILWAY. The accounts of the last and the estimates for the ensuing year, will be laid before you. Among them will be found to have been prepared with due regard to economy and the efficiency of the public service.

THE SUPERANNUATION OF MR. PATRICK. On returning from the Senate, the Commission returned to the session. The Speaker announced the changes in the official staff of the House by the superannuation of Clerk Patrick, the promotion of Mr. Bourne, clerk assistant, to that office, and the abolishing the office of deputy clerk's assistant.
