

NEW YORK, Oct. 19—The United States secret service officers arrested two Chinamen as they alighted from the Boston express tonight. They were held on a charge of violating the Chinamen and The prisoners gave BERLIN, Oct. 20.—The construction of the ship canal between Berlin and Stettin has already been commenced.

The German government has granted \$11,000,000 for the making of the canal, which is part of the scheme for the construction of several new waterways which will be of considerable strategic, commercial and political importance.
