Thrilling Experiences of 4,000 Armenians After Their Banishment From Zeitoun.

Fled to The Mountain.

Knowing that it would be impossible to defend our villages in the foothills, it was resolved to withdraw to the heights of Mousa Dagh, taking with us as large a supply of food and implements as it was possible to carry. All the flocks of sheep and goats were also driven up the mountain side, and every available weapon of defence was brought out and furbished up. We found that we had 120 modern rifles and shot-guns, with perhaps three times that number of old flint-locks and horse-pistols. That still left more than half our men without weapons. It was very hard to leave our homes. My mother wept as it her heart would break. By nightfall the first day we had reached the upper crass of the mountain.

At dawn next morning all hands went to work digging trenches at the most stragetic points in the ascent of the mountain. Where there was no earth for trench-digging, rocks were rolled together, making strong barracades behing which groups of our sharpshooters were stationed. We were hard at it all day strengthening our position against the attack which we knew was certain to come.
