Narrow Escape. A young son of John Duffy, teamster, of Portland, had a narrow escape of a catfish. He was on top of a catfish of dead eels driving, when some of the blocks fell and struck the horse's feet. The animal started and ran some distance down Main street, then suddenly turned and ran towards an alley. The wheels struck the dead sidewalk and overturned the cart, burying the boy under the load. He fortunately fell in the gutter and a long piece of coal so completely covered him that the rest, in falling, did not strike him. His father, on seeing the horse start, ran to the rescue, and soon released him. The boy was not injured at all, though faint from the fright when taken out, and completely covered with mud. It was a very narrow escape. The horse fell on the sidewalk, but also escaped unhurt.

Accident on the Intercolonial Railway—An Engineer Seriously Injured.

An accident occurred this forenoon on the Intercolonial Railway, by which an engineer named Sears was seriously injured. The scene of the accident was at Sord's Bridge, about 2 1/2 miles this side of Apohaqui, and it happened in this way. Trackmen were engaged laying rails and had their flags out at the proper distance when a special working train, consisting of engine, tender, and twelve cars, came along. The train was going at a rapid rate, and it was while at the time. When the engineer saw the flags he endeavored to stop the train, but could not do so, as the wheels would not catch hold of the slippery rails. The train continued on its way until it came to the place where the workmen were employed at Sord's Bridge, where several rails were removed, when it ran off the track and was brought to a stand still on the bridge. The engine and tender and two cars were thrown on their sides and badly damaged. The engineer, Mr. Sears, stuck to his engine, and went over with it. The nature of his injuries were not known, but a telegram from the scene says they are quite serious. There will be some little delay to the afternoon freight train, but the track will be cleared and the bridge repaired in time for the evening train to pass over.

Youthful Depravity. Between 12 and 1 o'clock this afternoon two lads, between 14 and 15 years of age, almost destitute of clothing, and very much intoxicated, endeavored to create a sensation at the Railway Wharf, Portland Bridge, by throwing themselves into the water. One of them declared it to be his intention to drown himself, and the other, to all appearance, wished to join him. Each time they precipitated themselves into the water they were fished out again by means of a boat hook. The large crowd which had gathered to witness the disgraceful scene became at last thoroughly disgusted with the performance and chased the boys away from the wharf and into York Point where they disappeared.
