annually. Henry L. Fowler's flour and grist mill is a frame building, 32 x 42 feet, two storys high, with carding mill attached. Custom, grinding, and wool carding carried on. Patterdan's grist mill is also frame.

Churches.—The Episcopalian Church is a handsome brick erected in 1868, at a cost of \$3,000. Rev. Mr. Fletcher, incumbent. The Congregational Church is a frame erected in 1868. Rev. Mr. Salmon, minister. The Presbyterian is frame, which is to be replaced by a good brick building more favorably located. Rev. Mr. Bould, Linister. The Wesleyan Methodist Church is a frame, erected in 1862, on the Brook townline, one mile south of the village. Rev. Mr. Hicks, minister.

Schools.—The school house is a large two story frame building, where 150 pupils are educated. There is also a drill shed erected in

the village.
