City Wins Bid For International Shuffleboard Tourney

The city of Fredericton has been the confirmed host of the 1995 International Shuffleboard Championship.

The city bid for the tournament at the Shuffleboard's International's annual general meeting in Liechtenstein a couple of weeks ago but only recently official confirmation of the deal says Jane Fitt, who worked on the bid. Miss Fitt says that the championship will be in May 1995 and will feature a host entry, and 3 entries from North America, South America, Europe. The tournament is tentatively ticketed for the Aitken University Center.

Miss Fitt states that Shuffleboard Canada hopes that this tournament will not only develop the sport in Canada but will bring more attention to the sport. "We train really hard all year around usually about two hours a day but we're not taken seriously compared to other sports, I just don't know why. We have a really strong team and are ranked fifth in the world and we have a good chance of doing very well at the tournament."

Shuffleboard Canada will be looking for a head coach for the team. A resume detailing all coach-

Any applicants must be fully certified at the Level V under the Coaching Certification Program by the 1995 start date of the tournament. The deadline for coaching applications is September 30.

Rugby Teams To Tour The Southern States In Spring

UNB Ironbabys and STU Stompin' Tomcats are training for their southern US rugby tours which begin in early May and June. The clubs will travel to West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia.

Ironbabys have gone south in past years and have been training part of the winter for this tour. Coach Rob Cockborn says "We have been very successful in the past in the southern US beating most of the teams that we have played. This year the tour will be extremely important to us as in the Fall there will be AUAA Men's Rugby League. We expect that our toughest competition in the league will come from the Stompin' Tomcats as Peter Bacey has done a lot of recruiting and he has managed to get some big players for next year from the National Team. We're going to have a hard time with our recruiting as Bacey has convinced all of the good players in the province to go to STU and they have been working very hard all winter."

Stompin' Tomcats under the guidance of Peter Bacey have been training since the end of last season indoors and they started training in March on The Swamp Field. Bacey said "We have done a lot of

training for the upcoming AUAA season we were a pretty good team last year. We were beat by the Ironbabys 'A' Team last year, so we have worked all winter so that we can beat them this year. We also have some really good recruits for next year our key recruits are Billy 'Bruiser' MacGregor from Burnaby, BC, Shamus Campbell from Cape Breton both are big players. We're working on building a bigger scrum than last year, it will be over 1000 pounds which is what we had last year. Unfortunately we couldn't get Ben Johnston as a winger, which would have been a great asset to the team, as he would be untouchable by any other team. Bacey believes that

having the team train at The Swamp will only make the team tougher and harder to beat once they go on tour.

AUAA league will consist of UNB, STU, Redneck U Huskies, UPEI Pussycats, Mt. A Alley Cats and Acadia Axemurders. Freddy Beach Rebels and Saint John Trajons will also be in the league although they will have to change a few rules about the eligibility of their players. The league will begin play in September and will continue until November when most teams will begin their indoor season just so that the players can play all year round. There is a tentative slate of teams scheduled to play in the indoor league.
