that necessarily they suffered great hardship or injustice. It did mean, however, that it was taken for granted that certain individuals were in the nature of privileged classes, and that, among other of their privileges, was that of having the exclusive right to govern.

From that day to this the belief in "superior persons" who alone are worthy of being entrusted with government, has persisted. From that day to this the belief in privilege and what it accords of the right to determine the conditions under which others have the right to live, has constituted a sharp dividing line between those who adhere to that point of view, and those who hold a point of view diametrically the opposite. It is here that you get the beginnings of what, through the ages, has constituted the line of demarcation which has, by whatever names they may have been a lied, distinguished in politics the one attitude of heart and mind from the other which is its opposite.

It must be apparent that sconer or later the injustice of according particular rights to the privileged simply because they wore privileged, and denying those rights to those not similarly possessed of privilege, must have created a serious difficulty in point of view between those who were
