Sir.-

With reference to previous correspondence I beg to inform you that an Order-in-Council was passed on the 4th instant authorizing an expenditure of \$1325.00 from the funds of the Campbell River Band to improve the water supply on their Reserve in the Sayward District. You may take the necessary action to have the work contemplated undertaken as seen as possible, provided that the time is opportune. A supply of labour return forms is being sent you for use by the foremen, for making returns in duplicate of the work done. An advance will be made to you ee soon as you inform the Department that you are ready to have the work begum, and that the money is required. Mr. John Wateon may be employed as foremen. He will be allowed \$5.00 a day for his services. You should endeavour to employ the labourers at as reasonable a rate as possible. It is hoped that the work will be well cone, and that the Indiens will realise that their money has been judiciously expended.
