I have had before me your report on those Indians of Oremecte, who are suffering from syphilis, and evidently, it is impossible to have those people consider the seriousness of their condition.

Thile seem have taken their treatment regularly and have improved, others have left the reserve and, no doubt, onet aside for the time being all thought of medical treatment. It would seem that the experiment is doesed to failure. He doubt, you are more that the Department is not prepared to carry on this treatment indefinitely.

Tour remarks in regard to the Banh infant are noted and the question of treatment is left to your judgement.
