

fixteen and seventeen years of age were, in consequence thereof, last year, sent back to the Divisions whence they had been ordered to join the Embodied Battalions, and men of forty-five years of age and upwards, have much less facility of acquiring a knowledge of the use of arms, and the other duties of an Embodied Militia-man. Moreover, because Bachelors make a lesser sacrifice in quitting their homes, than men having families to bring up and support, and are also less burthensome to the Country.

The same being then taken into consideration,

ORDERED, That this House doth insist on their amendments.

ORDERED, That Two Hundred Copies of the Journals of the present Session be printed in both languages, for the use of the Members of this House, under the superintendence of the Clerk of this House, and that it is the opinion of this House, that a remuneration, not exceeding One Hundred Pounds, should be made to the Clerk of the Parliament, for his extra trouble in superintending the printing of the said Journals in both languages, and that he be authorised to procure such additional assistance as he shall find necessary, to enable him to cause the said Journals to be published as speedily as possible, and that he do charge the expence attending the same in the future Contingent Accounts of this House.

RESOLVED, That a Committee of three Members be appointed to determine upon, and superintend such Repairs and Improvements as may be required for the accommodation of this House at the next sitting of the Provincial Parliament, and that the said Committee be authorised to submit to His Excellency the Governor in Chief such Repairs and Improvements, for his approbation and concurrence.

ORDERED, That the Honorable Messrs. *Duchefnay, Ryland and Blackwood* be the said Committee.

ORDERED, That a Committee be appointed to examine the Journals of this House from the time when they were last printed, and that they
