THIRTEEN Members being met, agreeable to the Proclamation.

House met.

Message from His Excellency.

The Speaker and the House attended accordingly,

And being returned,

The Speaker *reported*, that the House had attended upon His Excellency in the Council-Chamber, where He was pleased to make a Speech, of which the Speaker said, he had, to prevent Mistakes, obtained a Copy; which he read to the House, and is as followeth;

GENTLEMEN of the Council, and House of Assembly.

“ **H**IS Majesty having been graciously pleased to appoint me Lieutenant-Governor of this Province, I have, in Conformity to His Majesty’s Commission and Instructions, assumed the Administration of the Government committed to my Charge.
“ Among the first and most pleasing of my official Duties, I consider the Honor now presented to me, of meeting you in *General-Assembly*, and adding my best Assistance to your Legislative Deliberations for the Prosperity of the Province.
