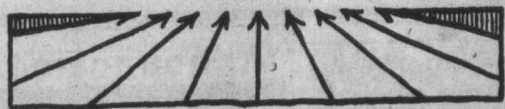

Supreme Court

The October term of the Supreme Court opened at Kentville, on Tuesday last with his Honor Mr. Justice Cr.-holm, presiding. Besides the members of the local bar were present Mr. Sangster K. C. of Windsor and Mr. Herman C. Morse of Bridgetown.

Mr. W. E. Roscoe K. C. on behalf of the members of the bar congratulated his Honor on his elevation to the Bench this being his first session here since his appointment.

The Criminal docket was as follows:

The King vs. Ansley McDow for manslaughter.

The King vs. Judson Webster.

The King vs. Ambrose DeAdder.

The King vs. Loring Parks.

The Grand Jurors were duly sworn and after deliberation returned the

bills in all four criminal cases.

The case against McDow for manslaughter arising out of the recent auto accident at Wolfville, and the death of the little Bishop girl of New Minas. The case lasted until Wednesday morning and a number of witnesses were examined as follows: Charles Hog n, Everett Smith, Dr. Elliott, Dorothy Bishop, Margaret McInnis, Mr. Gertrid, Robt Bishop, Mrs Margaret Schofield, Thompson, Tyle Hancock, Freeman Crowell, G. C. Gertrid, Lewis McGinnis, Frank Delabaunt.

At eleven o'clock Wednesday Mr. Sangster addressed the jury for the defence and Mr. Hely for Crown.

The Jury returned a verdict of guilty against McDow. His Honor has not yet delivered sentence. all day Thursday the case of The King vs. Jeremiah Webster was heard and many witnesses examined.

There are 13 cases on the docket at or the criminal cases are tried.
