## Local and General

R. E. Mickleborough returned last week from a visit to the east.

The Moose Jaw bonspiel commences on Monday next.

C. W. Blackstock left Vancouver yesterday on his return to Regina after a visit to the coast cities.

The Lansdowne hotel bulletined the reports of the Stanley cup matches in Montreal.

The Regina Curling club tendered a smoker to the visiting curlers on Thursday evening last.

Mr. Justice Prendergast was in the city a few days ago en route to St. Boniface.

Dr. Graham who with his family went to Vancouver to spend the winter is in the city on real estate business.

Cigars and whiskey have been stolen from cars in the yards here and the R.N.W.M.P. are investigating the matter.

In clearing out an old safe G. T. Marsh found the original charter of the Regina board of trade. This document will no doubt find a place in the city archives.
