NORTHERN PACIFIC FISH

The opportunities which are offering in all lines of trade and resourcefulness on the Pacific Coast is demonstrated by the fact the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage and fish freezing plant at Ritchie Point in the City of Prince Rupert, B. C., the Western terminus of the Grand Trunk Pacific Ry. It has been built for the handling of the fish industry of the Northern Pacific Ocean.

The waters surrounding Prince Rupert teem with Halibut, Ling and Grey Cod, Salmon, Sole, Herring, etc., the market for which is unlimited, and with the completion of the Railway the fish can be in transit to the Eastern markets on the same day as caught, thus arriving with speedy transportation, their arrival in first-class condition at destination.

The building is constructed of reinforced concrete throughout. The foundation is built on solid rock, and is of sufficient strength to carry the building to the height of ten stories. The present structure is six stories high, and can be extended as soon as trade permits.

The daily fish freezing capacity will be sixty tons, and the storage capacity of frozen fish about 6500 tons.

The ice making plant is of 25 tons daily capacity, and space has been left for an additional 25 tons for future installation.

Over 30 miles of piping was required for the refrigerator installation. Twenty-three car-loads of cork were used in the building for the flooring and for the partitions between each room.

No Entrance Fee

It appears that the circular from the Education Department relative to the matter of a fee of \$1.00 to be charged pupils for writing on the High School Entrance examination has been misinterpreted. A circular recently issued makes it plain that the imposition of the fee is optional with High School Boards. As the execution of this fee by one high school district would simply have the effect of causing candidates to go to some district where the fee was not charged, it is not likely that many boards will take advantage of the opportunity of making money in that way.

HIGH SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

At a meeting of the High School Board held on Monday last it was decided to ask the municipalities comprising the high school district to raise the 30-year debentures the sum of \$6 000 to permanently improve the present school building.

This sum would enable the Board to make such improvements and improvements as would meet the requirements of the Education Department and would qualify the school to receive a largely increased annual grant. Without these improvements, a serious reduction will be made in the present grants and the school will be continued at a much heavier annual charge for maintenance than would be required to pay all charges, including the retirement of the debentures, with an improved school building.

This is a perfectly plain statement of the position as viewed by members of the Board. The Board did not create the conditions with which they are confronted, but assuming a man having a stake in the district they have decided upon this course as being the best both financially and in the interests of the students.
