cloth wrapped around a stick. Any acid accumulations are then loosened and may be cleanly removed by simply wipin
After this, ordinary metal polish used for brass work should be applied with a linen
clot cloth and the polishing rarried out with
soft woolen cloth. If the surfaces are slow to respond to the polishing try a good carriage maker's metal polish made as
follows: Twenty parts of whiting, one part of soda, one quarter part of citric water for using.
