#### ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY'S CATTLE SHOW.

In giving in our last issue the list of Prizes awarded on Wednesday last owing to the lateness of the day when the list was furnished, two errors were committed which we hasten to correct, viz: The two prizes for Horses were awarded, the first to A. Laird, Esq., for the best Filly for Agricultural purposes, the second to the Hon. G. Cole, instead of the first and second blood Colts, as printed in the list. There was no competition for Blood Colts, or rather a sufficient number were not entered for competition, so as to enable the Judges to award a prize.

With respect to the Exhibition in general, we have only to remark that, it appeared to be universally considered that, though the number exposed for competition was not so great as that of the last year, the animals that were on the ground were all of a good quality; no inferior animals being exhibited, with the exception of Horses; and this may be easily accounted for, when the number sold and sent out of the Island last autumn, and this season, is taken into consideration. We regret to state that it was attended with rather more than the usual average of drunkenness.
