SPORTS AND PASTIMES
Football
Teams from the Crescent and St. Dunstan's College Football Clubs played a match game at Victoria Park on Thursday evening.

The Montreal and Toronto who withdrew from this league have arranged to play a series of five games with each other for a \$2000 prize.
The first game in the New Brunswick Lacrosse series, for the N. A. L. championship was played at St. John on Saturday. The opposing teams were the Union and Beavers. The former won 2 to 0. The Shamrock and Y. M. C. A. Athletic clubs teams are also represented in the league. At the close of the series the winner plays off with the Nova Scotia champions for the Nelson trophy.
