Current Business Conditions

(From the Monthly Letter Issued by The National City Bank of New York for January)

IN an industrial forecast for 1922 it is necessary to consider the causes of the depression, chief among which is the unbalanced relationship between the prices of raw materials and the prices of manufactured goods.

The final estimates of the Department of Agriculture upon the 1921 crop give them a market value to the farmers \$8,000,000 below the value of the crop of 1918 and \$3,400,000,000 below the value of the crop of 1919.

In large part the situation is chargeable to the action of organized labor in clinging to the wartime wage rates.
