



Finally, bear in mind that you can obtain passports, circular notes, and letter sof credit from your bank. This is a long list of the services it will do you for the asking, and yet it is not exhaustive. Some customers even have letters addressed care of their bank, which they also utilize to the utmost in connection with references. Others resort to it for such an outof-the-way commodity as sweepstake tickets.

A Fish Story

With a rather glassy expression its eye, a giant swordfish dominates the entrance to the New Zealand Pavilion at Wembley. But the swordfish is not complete.
